In Loving Memory of Benjamin Franklin Miller November 10, 1931 – April 13, 2025

Benjamin Franklin Miller, affectionately known as “Ben,” peacefully transitioned from this life on Sunday, April 13, 2025. Born in Deerfield Beach, Florida, on November 10, 1931, he was the beloved son of the late Reuben and Emily Miller.

A man of great wisdom, vision, and faith, Ben was deeply committed to education, community service, and spiritual leadership. His academic journey began at Braite Waite Jr. High School in Deerfield Beach and continued through Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale. He proudly graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in Miami in 1950. Ben’s love for learning led him to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree from the distinguished Morehouse College and a Master’s degree from Atlanta University. His thirst for knowledge inspired further studies at five other universities across the country.

In 1956, Ben honorably answered the call to serve his country in the United States Army, where he served as a cryptographer in the European Theater. He was honorably discharged in 1958.

Education was not only Ben’s career—it was his calling. He began teaching in

Atlanta, Georgia, in 1955 and later returned to Florida to lead as department chair at Dillard High School. He also taught at Broward County Junior College (now Broward College), leaving a lasting legacy in the lives of countless students. Known affectionately as “Mr. Ben,” his dedication in the classroom was matched only by his devotion to his community.

A faithful and lifelong member of the Cathedral Church of God in Deerfield Beach, Ben served in many capacities, including Sunday School teacher, choir member, and member of the Benevolence Committee. He also accepted the sacred call to ministry, becoming a servant of the gospel.

Ben’s passion for service extended far beyond the walls of the church. He coached Little League baseball for the Pompano Westside Recreational League and served as the varsity coach at Dillard High School. Spanning more than five decades, Ben’s civic contributions helped shape the Pompano Beach community. He served as Chairman of the Community Advisory Development Committee, was a member of the Pompano Beach Planning and Zoning Board for 46 years, and contributed to the Redevelopment Committee of the City of Pompano Beach. Additionally, he held leadership roles as President of Vision Inc., President of Miller Economic Development Inc., Secretary of the Westside Kiwanis Club, and President of the Allen Park Home Association. He was also a proud member of the Broward County Morehouse Alumni Chapter.

Ben was united in holy matrimony to the late Blanche Daniels, who preceded him in death. He is survived by his loving children: Rev. Keith (Vernease) Miller of Charlotte, NC; Ronald (Kimberly) Miller of Miami, FL; Berand (Patricia) Miller of Coral Springs, FL; Derrick (Andrea) Miller of Stone Mountain, GA; Anthony Miller of Pompano Beach, FL; Bena Miller of Manassas, VA; and Evangela (Terry) Budgett of Fort Lauderdale, FL.

He also leaves to cherish his memory his siblings: Jerelean Lattimore of Pennsauken, NJ; Aston (Carolyn) Miller of West Palm Beach, FL; Cedric (Sharon) Miller of Franklin, VA; Carolyn Miller Menendez of Boynton Beach, FL; Eugene (Mary) Miller of Atlanta, GA; Priscilla Miller Jones of Boynton Beach, FL; and Quan (Patricia) Miller of Orlando, FL; sister-in-law: Gerri Miller-Cummings, Garden Cove, CA; like a brother, Willie Gunn, Sr., who preceded him in death; and his beloved friends of more than 60 years Dr. Augusta A. Clark, "Gussie" and Delano Stewart, "Dale".

Ben's legacy continues through his 27 grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family, friends, church members, and devoted caregivers.

Ben Franklin Miller will be remembered for his gentle spirit, profound humility, quick wit, and unwavering commitment to his faith, family, and community. His life was a beacon of hope, a pillar of strength, and a testament to the power of service and love.

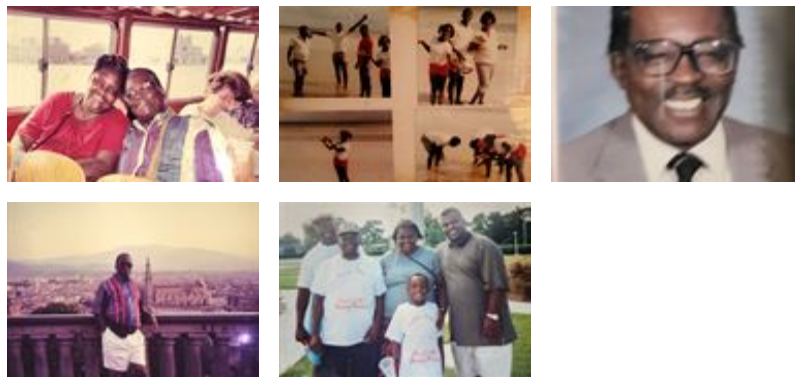

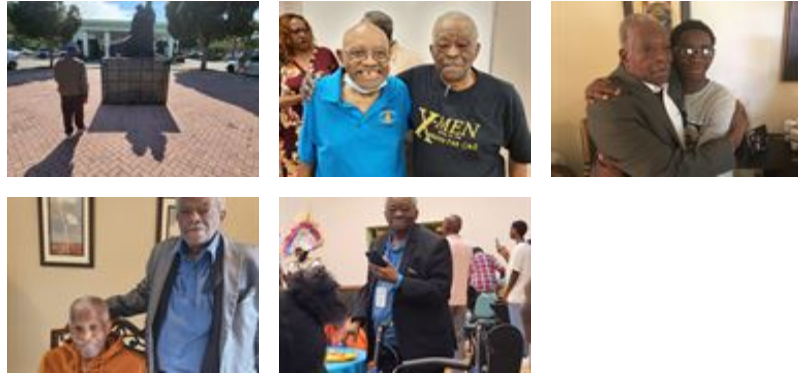

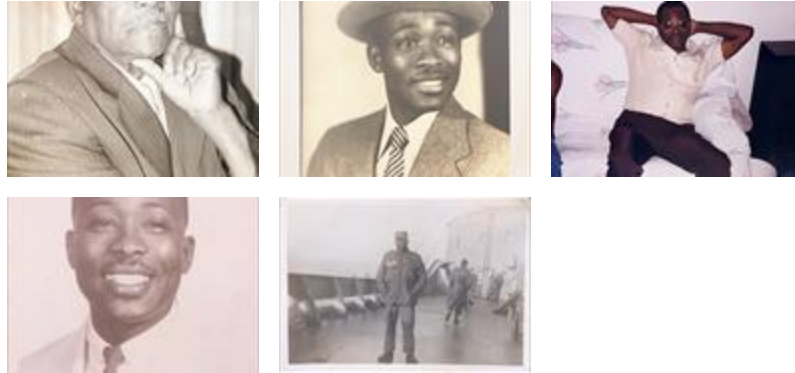
