In 1972, She was transferred to Broadview Elementary for integration purpose. While working at Broadview

She continued this behavior throughout her lifetime by tutoring in her handy dandy garage. She was one of the greatest teachers and tutors in Broward County, Florida.

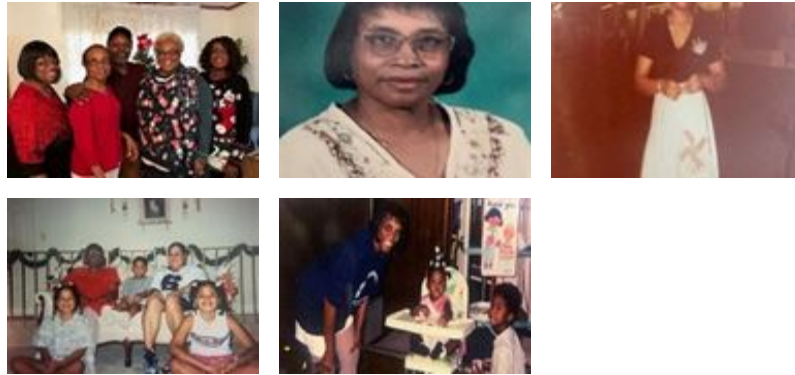

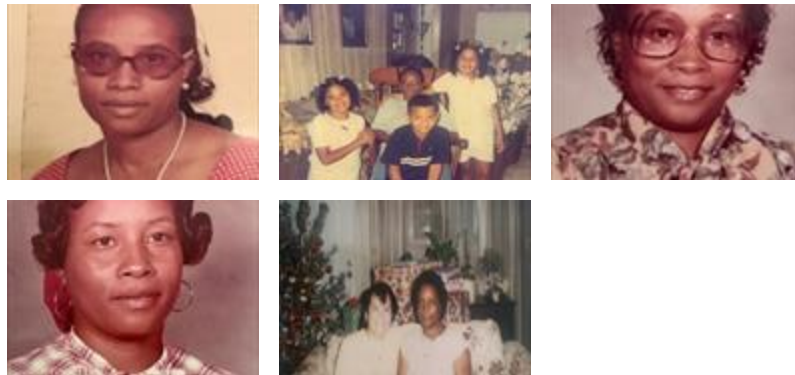
