He joined the United States Army in the year of 1953 where he proudly served our country for two years in the Korean War. He was honorably discharged at the rank of Private First Class in 1955.

the Lord.

For the past 50 plus years, Homer and Ann (Battle) Baker built a wonderful life together. In that union he inherited a daughter, Audrey and a son Clyde. He moved to Somers Point, New Jersey where he settled in for good. He was well-known in the community; when neighbors and friends passed by, they would either honk their horn or call out to him as they approached the stop sign. His response was a big smile and a wave. This was a daily routine. His family called him the "Honorary mayor of Somers Point". Homer was a member of Faith Baptist Church in Pleasantville, New Jersey where he served in the host/hostess ministry. Homer was very sociable and enjoyed being around people. For many years he looked forward to attending the Annual Black & White Ball, which was an event that he enjoyed with family and friends. He also hosted many Super Bowl parties in his hotel room. He enjoyed attending the big screening in the casino ballroom. Homer was most proud of having gone on 27 "family and friends" cruises with his special friends, the McFarland's. Also, he liked having fun at the horse track and frequenting the casinos. While visiting family in Florida he enjoyed checking out the dog track. He also enjoyed playing a game of spades, where he couldn't fool anyone if he had a good hand. He would sit there with that big smile on his face. 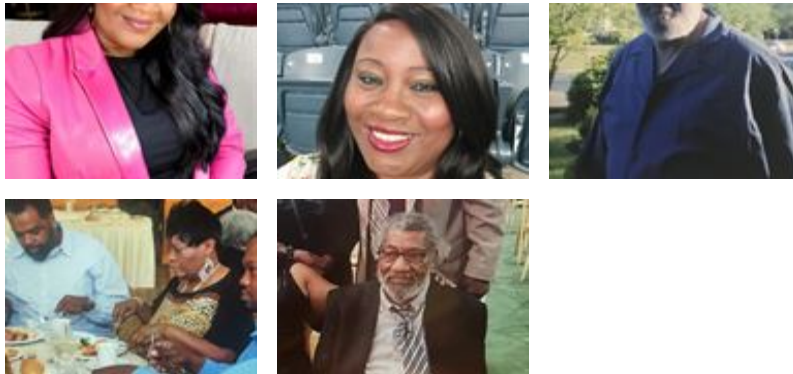

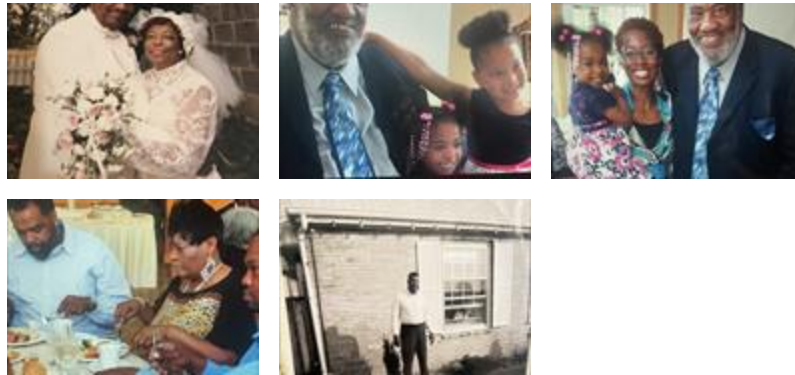
