July 1, 1971 - October 26, 2017

Trevor Anton Mitchell was born on July 1, 1971 to Wallace Mitchell and the late Kathleen White in West Palm Beach, Florida.

He attended Palmview Elementary, Crystal Lake Middle and graduated from Ely High School in 1990. Trevor played basketball for ET Express at Ely High School and was known for his charming personality and ability to make everyone laugh.

After high school, Trevor joined the United States Marine Corp. He completed basic training in Parris Island, South Carolina and did tours in Japan and Hawaii. He served his country during the Desert Storm War. His bravery and service earned him several honors including the Meritorious Mass, The Sea Service Deployment Medal, The National Defense Service Medal and Rifle Marksman Badge. He was honorably discharged due to a medical injury in October 1993. After returning to South Florida, Trevor was employed by U.S. Concrete, United States Postal Service and Broward County Transit upon his untimely death .

He enjoyed fishing, watching football, cheering for the Dallas Cowboys, barbequing and doing for others. Trevor was often described as loving, caring, friendly and generous. When he wasn't working, he could be found spending quality time with his friends and loving family. As a result of his generous and joyful spirit, he was well known throughout Broward County.

He accepted Christ into his life at a young age of 7, upon joining the House of God Church Pompano #1 under the auspices of Bishop B. J. McCormick.

Cherished and loving memories will always linger in the hearts of all who knew him. He leaves to mourn his father, Wallace Mitchell; two sons Deshawn Aliileleiotumua and Trevon Tama'alii Ah Loo Mitchell; two sisters Chiquita Barthel and Nicole Mitchell; one brother Martell Mitchell, and one brother in law Kelvin Barthel; Uncles Johnny Mitchell, Vincent Edwards, and Aunts DeeDee White, Pearl Johnson, Varrie Bibb, Charlotte Edwards, Evelyn Graham, Bessie Graham, and Janice Rolle whom he looked up to as a mom. Special friends Alvin Fulwood and De'Angelo Eiland Sr and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

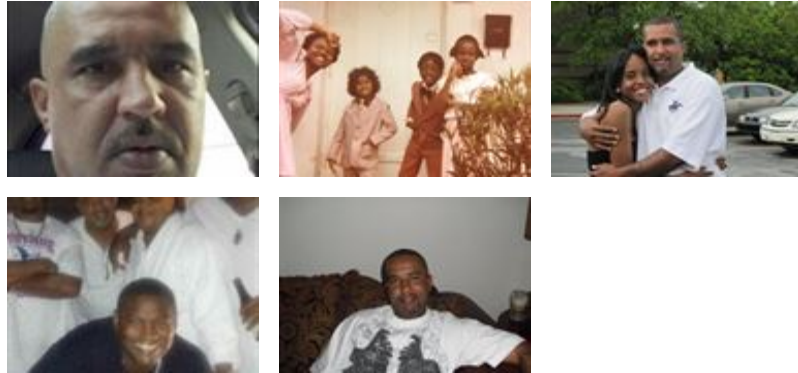

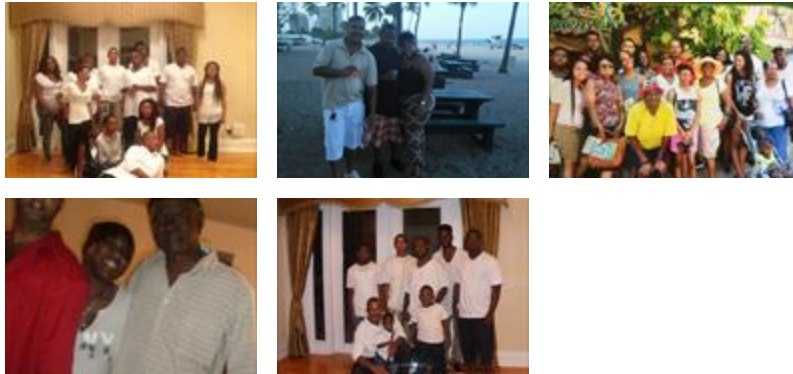

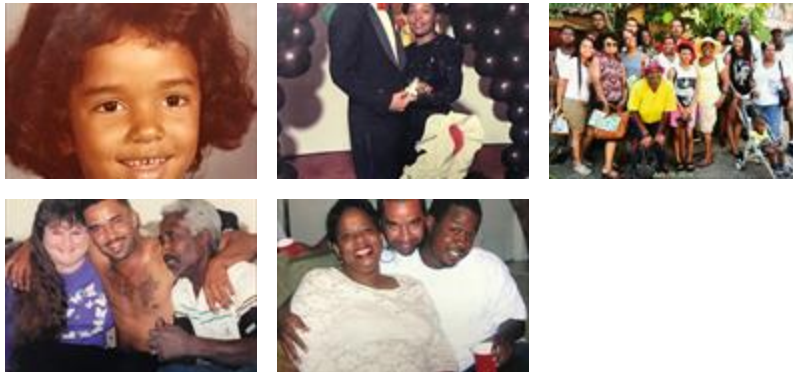
