Wesley Gervilus–Moimeme was born on January 13, 1997, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to parents Trezilia Moimeme and Petit Gervilus. He was the younger brother of Cherlinda Philix, on his mother’s side—they were nine years apart.

Wesley was raised in Pompano Beach and received his early education at Markham Elementary School. He continued on to Crystal Lake Middle School and later Blanche Ely High School

Wesley was raised in a Caribbean household, the son of two hardworking parents born in Haiti. Despite humble beginnings, he grew up in a home where dedication and sacrifice were constant—his parents worked tirelessly to provide for their family and build a better life.

From a young age, Wesley showed a passion for music and dancing. He had a lively sense of humor and often made those around him laugh, earning him the title of “class clown” among his peers. Wesley had a presence that could not be ignored—he was bold, expressive, and full of energy.

Wesley was known for his free spirit—unapologetically himself, he never held back from speaking his truth or expressing how he felt.

His life was not without struggle. He wrestled with his own challenges and

carried weight that was visible to others. Those who knew him understood that behind the layers was someone still trying to figure it all out.

On July 8, 2025, Wesley's life ended tragically due to a hit-and-run. He was only 28 years old.

Wesley's story was still unfolding. He was figuring things out. He was human—flawed, searching, and trying like the rest of us. His loss is not just a moment; it's a break in the middle of a life that still had more to become.

His life, though cut short, left a lasting impact on those who knew him. He was a brother, a son, and an uncle.

Wesley is survived by his mother, Trezilia Moimeme; father, Petit Gervilus; sister, Cherlinda Philix; and his beloved niece, Ava Macillon. He also leaves behind extended family members and many friends
